SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND CONSENT ORDER

This Matter comes before the Maryland Real Estate Commission (Commission) based on a complaint filed by Allen Lucas against Ebon Jackson (Respondent). Based on the complaint, the Commission determined that administrative charges were appropriate and that a hearing on the charges should be held. Prior to the matter being scheduled for hearing, the Commission and Respondent agreed to consent to the entry of this Order as final resolution of Complaint No. 16-RE-278.

IT IS STIPULATED BY THE PARITES THAT:

- 1. The Respondent is currently licensed as a real estate broker associated with New Realty, LLC.
- 2. The charges in this matter arise from a complaint filed by Ivory Wood and Preston Twyman, the purchasers of a property known as 11610 Mordente Drive in Clinton, MD.
- 3. The Respondent was showing houses to the complainants who were interested in purchasing a home.
- 4. The complainants provided emails which show the respondent giving codes to the complainants in order to view homes themselves.
- 5. The Respondent states the complainants did view a few properties without him being present.
- 6. The Respondent enters this Consent Order freely, knowingly, voluntarily, and after having had the opportunity to seek the advice of counsel.
- 7. By entering into this Consent Order, the Respondent expressly waives the right to any hearing or further proceeding to which he may be entitled in this matter and any rights to appeal from this Consent Order.

8. The Respondent agrees to abide by the Maryland Real Estate Brokers Act, Maryland Annotated Code, Business Occupations and Professions Article, Sections 17-101 *et. seq.*, and regulations of the Commission in future real estate transactions.

BASED ON THESE STIPULATIONS, IT IS, THIS 3 at day of august, 2016, BY THE MARYLAND REAL ESTATE COMMISSION,

ORDERED that the Respondent has violated section 17-322 (b)(25) of the Business Occupations and Professions Article, Maryland Annotated Code.

ORDERED that the Respondent pay a fine of \$2,500.00 in connection with the violation within sixty (60) days of the date of this Consent Order and

ORDERED that in the event the terms and conditions of this Consent Order are not met by the Respondent within the time described, the Commission will immediately suspend all real estate licenses held by the Respondent, without a hearing on the suspension. The suspension will continue until such time as the Respondent evidences compliance with the terms of this Consent Order and it is further

ORDERED that the Commission's records and publications shall reflect the terms of this Consent Order.
