

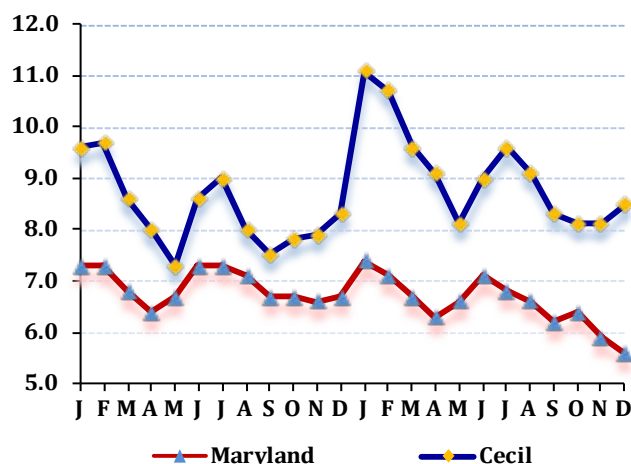

## UNEMPLOYMENT TRENDS - Jan. 2012-Dec. 2013\*



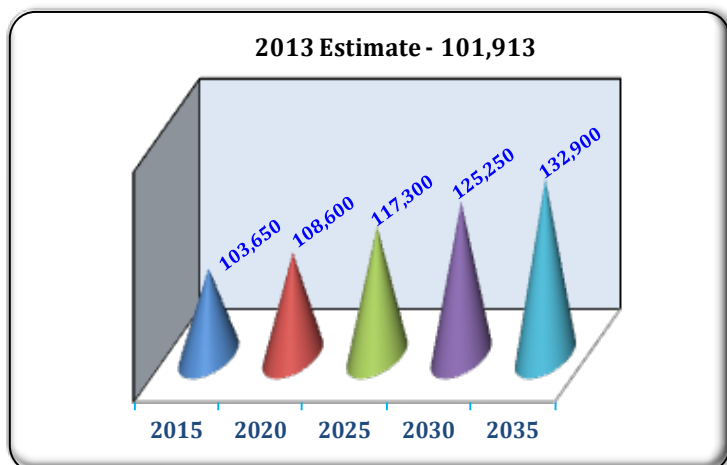

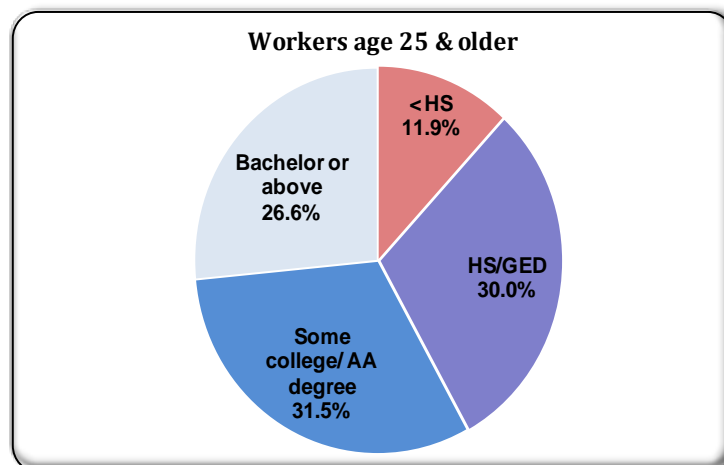
