- The presentation included research on existing cyber clinic models.
- Successful clinics have features like full-time coordinators and client-facing services.
- Focus areas: Improving cybersecurity posture of real clients and training at least 100 learners.



 Priority sectors include K-12 schools, water infrastructure, and community health systems.

 Goal: Strengthen workforce pipeline and support lower-level talent development.
