3. Description of the training offered:

The Living Classrooms Foundation works in partnership with Project Jumpstart to provide a 14-week construction training program for Baltimore City residents. Experienced teachers help students understand job readiness and prepare for success on the construction site. Students also receive essential safety training, financial coaching, a stipend, and driver's education. A total of 80% of graduates are placed in construction jobs, with many leading to solid careers in the construction industry.

4. Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

- CPR
- First Aid
- OSHA 10

5. Am I eligible?

Must:

- Be 18 and older.
- Be a Baltimore City resident.
- Have a high school diploma or in the process of obtaining a high school diploma.

6. What is the application process?

All interested candidates must participate in an enrollment process which includes orientation, intake, and a reading and math assessment.

7. How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment in the construction field?

The average annual pay for an entry level construction worker in Maryland is \$37,895.
