Organization providing the training:

The B&O Railroad Museum - Restore Baltimore

Physical Location where training occurs:

The B&O Railroad Museum, 901 West Pratt Street, Baltimore, MD 21223

Description of the training offered:

Restore Baltimore is a 6-month skilled trades workforce training program to prepare qualified Maryland residents for careers in rail, construction, and facilities maintenance. Participants earn a stipend of \$15/hour while enrolled. The program all takes place on the Museum's 40-acre campus in Southwest Baltimore. Participants are automatically enrolled as CCBC students

Restore Baltimore participants are CCBC students on the B&O Campus, directed and instructed by CCBC. CCBC instructors select the projects from the B&O Campus for the students to learn from. The program holds two cohorts of 5-6 students each per year. Students receive expert instruction, wrap-around services, and career coaching. Restore Baltimore participants receive over 100 hours of seated technical instruction, teaching them important technical skills that enable them to receive industry-recognized certifications

Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

- National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Core Level certification in Basic Construction Skills
- Restore Baltimore Trade Skills – Parts A & B
- Forklift Operation
- “Blue Flag” railroad safety training
- OSHA 10
- First Aid/CPR & AED training



Participants are also eligible to enroll in additional instructions to obtain their Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) driver's license.

Am I eligible?

Candidates must be a US citizen or eligible to work in the United States and over 18 years of age to qualify.

What is the application process?

- Attend one information session at the Museum on career pathways in transportation construction. Visit the Restore Baltimore on the Museum website for the schedule OR call the number below.
- Complete reading and math assessments to enroll (scores neither qualify nor disqualify candidates; they just help inform course instruction).
- Attend a mandatory two-day workshop that includes a museum tour and a question-and-answer session with current program participants.
- Complete one-on-one interviews
- Take the drug test and background check.

How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment?

On average, 85% of participants are employed within six months of program completion, earning an average wage of \$21/hour. Graduates from the Carpentry training program can earn \$22.50/hour. Graduates of the rail training program may earn \$32/hour.
