Description of the training offered:

Project JumpStart provides a nationally recognized, apprenticeship-aligned pre-apprenticeship training program designed to prepare Baltimore City residents for careers in the construction and transportation industries.

The program is approximately 15 weeks in length and includes:

- Hands-on construction training
- Job readiness and employability skills
- Safety training and workplace expectations
- Exposure to multiple trades, including construction craft labor, electrical, plumbing/mechanical, and carpentry trades.
- Exposure and opportunities for careers in the construction, transportation, and infrastructure industries.
- Direct connections to employers and Registered Apprenticeship programs

Participants also receive comprehensive supportive services, including case management, transportation assistance, legal assistance, and referrals to community resources, to support successful completion and transition into employment or apprenticeship.

Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

Participants may earn:

- OSHA 10
- CPR/First Aid Certification



Am I eligible?

To be eligible, applicants must:

- Be a Baltimore City resident
- Be at least 18 years old
- Be legally authorized to work in the United States
- Be physically able to perform construction-related work
- Demonstrate interest in construction, transportation, or related trades
- Meet employer and apprenticeship program hiring requirements, including drug screening where applicable.
- Have their high school diploma, GED, or be willing to obtain it.

Applicants must also be willing to commit to the full training schedule and participate in job placement and apprenticeship opportunities.

What is the application process?

The application process includes:

- Submitting an initial online application
- Attending an information session
- Completing an interview and assessment
- Participating in orientation prior to enrollment

Applicants are evaluated based on interest, commitment, and readiness for training and employment. Supportive services are available to assist eligible participants with barriers to successful program completion and employment.

How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment?

Entry-level construction or transportation-related positions earn approximately \$18–\$25 per hour, depending on the employer and role. Participants who enter Registered Apprenticeship programs can expect wages to increase over time as they gain skills and progress in their trade.
