Jobs for Veterans State Grants	Provides federal funding to hire dedicated staff to provide individualized career and training-related services to veterans and eligible persons with significant barriers to employment and to connect employers with qualified job-seeking veterans. Unemployment Insurance	Temporary financial assistance to qualifying unemployed workers while they seek work.	U.S. Department of Labor	MD Labor

Reentry Employment Opportunities	Grants to develop or expand programs to improve employment opportunities for adults ages 18-24 who have been incarcerated in the youth or adult criminal justice system, and adults ages 25 or older, released from prison or jail within two years of enrollment. Community Service Block Grant	A federally funded block grant that supports services that alleviate the causes and conditions of poverty in under resourced communities. Services and activities include housing, nutrition, utility, and transportation assistance; employment, education, and other income and asset building services; crisis and emergency services; and community asset building initiatives, among other things.
