Attention Innkeeper or Lodging Establishment Owner:

In an effort to combat the scourge of human trafficking, the General Assembly passed a law, Business Regulations Article, Sec. 15-210, requiring that on or before October 1 each year, all innkeepers in the State of Maryland must certify to the Department of Labor that all employees have received mandatory annual educational training regarding the identification and reporting of suspected human trafficking.

If you have already submitted your annual certification, thank you for your prompt compliance with this important law.

If you have not completed the training and submitted the required certification, please ensure that the required training is completed **immediately** and submit the required certification to the Maryland Department of Labor, <a href="mailto:mddol.innkeepers@maryland.gov">mddol.innkeepers@maryland.gov</a> as soon as possible. The **failure to do so is a violation of Maryland law.**
