CALL TO ORDER:

Board Chair Glenn Fishack, Sr. called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Karen Nicklas made a motion to approve the minutes with changes. The motion was seconded by Stephen Pastusak. The motion passed unanimously.

REGULATION UPDATE:

Trampolines:

Robbie Finecey shared the recommendations of the subcommittee formed to discuss adoption of the ASTM F2970-2022 trampoline standard. The subcommittee recommended that the standard be adopted with the exception of the definition of "major modification" in section 8.1 of the standard. The subcommittee felt that the COMAR definition of "major modification" was preferable to the ASTM definition. The subcommittee further recommended that the standards apply to any trampoline or trampoline park installed after January 1, 2025. *Motion#1:* Stephan Pastusak put forth a motion recommending that the Commissioner adopt the ASTM trampoline standard subject to the recommendations of the subcommittee. Roy Shaw seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Escape Rooms:

Robbie Finecey provided an update on the Safety Unit's inspection of the 38 Maryland escape room as of November 1, 2023. He explained the criteria used by the inspectors. He noted that many escape rooms change designs every 6-8 months to keep the interest of consumers.

Roy Shaw asked if the Unit has enough staff to regularly inspect newly added features like trampoline, ziplines and now escape rooms. Program staff responded that they have sufficient staff and that they try to schedule inspections of attractions such as escape rooms during the "off season."
