

APPRENTICESHIP REQUIREMENTS

Apprentice Barber: Sponsored by a Master Barber. Allowed a two-year original license and one two-year renewal. Must complete 2,250 hours of training with at least 30 hours per week. The maximum number of hours accepted per month is 240 hours. Barber & Barber Stylist Test Takers Guide

Apprentice Limited Barber-stylist: Sponsored by a Master Barber. Allowed a two-year original license and one two-year renewal. Must complete 1,650 hours of training with at least 30 hours per week. The maximum number of hours accepted per month is 240 hours.

^{***}The Limited Barber Stylist license was introduced for individuals who only wish to cut hair. The curriculum does not include chemical processes, and thus you would not be tested on that or be able to perform any such services once licensed***

KEY INFORMATION

- The Board of Barbers has no regulations regarding pay between sponsor and apprentice
 - We recommend coming to an agreement before beginning training and sticking to it throughout the duration of the program
- Apprentices must be supervised by the sponsor when providing services
- If you are licensed in another state you may qualify for licensure through reciprocity
- Sponsors may train a maximum of 3 apprentices at a time
- The shop, sponsor, and apprentice license registrations must be in good standing for credit to be reported for the apprentice
 - Active (not expired), No outstanding Tax Liabilities, Child Support Payments, Shop Consent Orders, etc.
- If an apprentice wishes to switch sponsors, they may do so without losing any previously reported credits. Find a new sponsor and submit an updated Sponsorship Jotform, indicate on the form that you are already a licensed apprentice
- A sponsor wishing to terminate an apprenticeship will need to contact the board (barb.cos@maryland.gov or 410-230-6190) and will be required to submit a notarized letter indicating your intent to end the training, provide each of your registration numbers, and the last day of work performed by the apprentice

MONTHLY REPORTS

- Regulations require monthly apprentice reports to be submitted online by the registered sponsor: https://www.dllr.state.md.us/cgi-bin/ElectronicLicensing/BAR/BARsponsor1.cgi
- The sponsor will login using their License Type, Registration Number, and Password
- Select the apprentice that you wish to report credit for, then scroll down to Reportable Hours
- Once you have successfully submitted credit for your apprentice, you will both receive a confirmation email reflecting what you have reported

BARBER PROHIBITIONS 09.16.02.03

The following services are prohibited in any barber shop or in regard to any shop-sponsored services:

• The performance of services of any kind on a client/licensee or registrant who has an infectious or contagious disease that presents a hazard to others.

• The performance of services of any kind upon the surface of a client's skin or scalp, where the skin or scalp is inflamed or where a skin infection or eruption is present, unless authorized by a physician.

 The presence of a dog, cat, bird, or any other animal on the shop premises with the exception of guide dogs for the blind.

• The integration of any other business unless the other business is separated from the barbershop by a permanent partition or wall that goes from floor to ceiling.

RECENTLY INTRODUCED LEGISLATION

HB 1547-State Board of Barbers- Domestic Violence Awareness Training

Requiring the State Board of Barbers and the State Board of Cosmetologists, beginning October 1, 2025, to require as a condition for licensure and initial renewal of a license an applicant or a licensee to complete certain training in domestic violence awareness; requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to approve certain domestic violence awareness training that is offered in person and virtually, includes guidance on certain topics, and has a duration of at least 1 hour; etc.
